RESOLUTION 10-2019 Schrantz Drive

RESOLVED that the Great Valley Town Board does hereby name the private roadway running off from Eagle-Forest State Road the Schrantz Drive, which is a private road, for the sole purpose of identification for emergency services, as approved by Dan Schrantz heirs.

NOTWITHSTANDING, nothing contained within this RESOLUTION shall constitute this as a public roadway, or that the Town of Great Valley claims any ownership to this road.

And HEREBY directs the Town Clerk to inform all government and emergency agencies.
