Building Code Officer – Supervisor Brown reported the following for Rich Rinko:

- One building permit was been issued \$25.00
- Property maintenance is in progress, several notices have gone out, but must wait until court resumes to proceed. The Co. Health Dept is in charge of Mike Beeles property, Bear Hollow, and the St. John Property on KillBuck Road.

Highway Superintendent – Supervisor Brown reported:

- The Town Board agreed to keep the department on call for emergencies until we are allowed to call them back into work.

MOTION was made by Supervisor Brown, seconded by Councilwoman Kruszynski to continue to keep the Highway on the payroll in an “On Call” until further notice. All in agreement.

TOWN HALL PAINTING BIDS

Supervisor Brown opened and read the single bid that was received:

Rinko Painting \$24,500

MOTION was made by Supervisor Brown, seconded by Councilwoman Goode to award the bid to Rinko Painting. All in agreement.

Maria Barrera, Bonn Way resident complained 3 weeks ago about low water pressure. Dale Dineen went up and replaced a pressure valve on the outside of her house. The Town Board will not allow these types of repair again. The Town has no responsibility for anything beyond the water hook up.

OLD BUSINESS

Supervisor Brown has spoken with Janet Cook, the Salamanca Board of Utilities, to inquire if the estimated rates for KillBuck resident could be negotiated. She responded negatively, and the Supervisor advised the Board to make a presentation directly to the Public Work Board in hopes of obtaining a rate reduction for the KillBuck residents. If the Board is not successful in this venture, it is not feasible to continue work on establishing a KillBuck Sewer District. Supervisor Brown has asked Attorney Peter Sorgi to halt his work on the formation of the district at this time.

Councilwoman Goode will contact the clerk with details on the Go Bike Trail feasibility study.
